2. ROLE OVERVIEW:
<p>One of RainbowYOUTH's strategic focus areas is "Serving our Māori and Pasifika whānau: Providing relevant services for queer, gender diverse and intersex rangatahi Māori and Pasifika young people"</p> <p>In 2018 a scoping report was produced, Te Haerenga Hōu. This assessed where RainbowYOUTH was at with its bicultural practice as an organisation, incorporating research and input from Māori and takatāpui elders about a possible way forwards, in order to become a bicultural (and ultimately multicultural) organisation. Following this report, a working group of RainbowYOUTH leadership and takatāpui staff and Board members has been formed, and an action plan with short, medium and long term goals (and associated actions) has been developed.</p>
